Europe day

- Europe Day is celebrated on 5 May by the Council of Europe and on 9 May by the European Union.
- The first recognition of Europe Day was by the Council of Europe, introduced in 1964.
- The European Union later started to celebrate its own European Day in commemoration of the 1950 Schuman Declaration, leading it to be referred to by some as "Schuman Day" or "Day of the united Europe". Both days are celebrated by displaying the Flag of Europe.

The institutions celebrate Europe Day

- To mark Europe Day, the EU institutions will open their doors to the public in Brussels and Strasbourg in May. EU local services in Europe and around the world will organize many activities and events for all ages.
- Every year, thousands of people take part in visits, debates, concerts and other events dedicated to Europe Day, which aim to raise awareness of the Union.



Celebration



- In many countries the celebration of the holiday is more solemn
- People gather in the square and watch to see the flag raised, accompanied by ceremonial music and military honors

Activities



- In different countries, people celebrate the holiday in other ways besides raising the flag
- Scattered presentations, projects or drawings are made to celebrate the holiday
- This is mostly done in schools by children and then uploaded to pages and shared with other countries

Activities

- On the squares, besides official ceremonies, people can see more things related to the holiday
- For example, different types of concerts: with dancers, singers and musicians
- In addition, some schools gather students and circle the square with the flag of the European Union and the flag of their country



In Bulgaria



- All these things are done in Bulgaria
- For several years now, a building has been selected and on the evening it is marked "Europe Day" with the flag of Bulgaria and the European Union

Cafe

- In Bulgaria, as well as in other countries, all the things that are made for the holiday are collected and presented to people while drinking coffee or something else
- In addition to these things, people also read works written by European authors
